A. Thomas Young is the former Director of NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center and President and COO of Martin Marietta. He retired from Lockheed Martin in July, 1995.

He is a Director of the Goodrich Corporation, Pepco Holdings, Inc., and Science Applications International Corporation. Mr. Young is an honorary Fellow of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA); a Fellow of the American Astronautical Society, Royal Aeronautical Society, and International Academy of Astronautics; and a member of the National Academy of Engineering.

He has received NASA's Distinguished Service Medal for his role in the Viking Project, the Outstanding Leadership Medal for his contributions to the Voyager Program, Presidential Rank Awards of Meritorious Executive and Distinguished Executive, the Public Service Medal for his leadership of the Mars Independent Assessment Team, and the Distinguished Public Service Medal for Leadership of the International Space Station Management and Cost Task Force. Mr. Young received the National Reconnaissance Office Medal for leadership of the Task Force on the Acquisition of National Security Space Programs and the AIAA Goddard Astronautics Award.

Mr. Young is active in various advisory activities associated with the US. space program.
